- ISYY supports wage equality between genders.
- Internships included in studies shall be flexible and paid.
- Internship support shall be directed at all students regardless of the field of studies.
- ISYY encourages the university, subject-specific student associations and
  campus organisations to promote the connection between studies and working
  life.
- o In this, the improvement of working life abilities should be considered,
  including high-quality career planning working groups, job application
  workshops and CV workshops.
  - The university shall develop possibilities to write theses for campus cities and regions.

- The planning of student housing shall consider the needs and wishes of
- 48 students. Student housing companies shall construct enough apartments of
- 49 different sizes, considering the apartments' location, accessibility and different
- 50 life situations.
- ISYY is in favour of sufficient amount of ecological and high-quality student
- 52 housing in campus cities.
- A student apartment shall be received in a reasonable time.
- ISYY encourages campus cities and the university to cooperate and to increase
- interaction in coordinating the increase of study places and housing production
- 56 in cities.

- If student housing companies monitor the progress of studies, it shall include reasonable flexibility for individual delays.
  - Monitoring the progress of studies shall be notified when making the rental agreement and student housing companies shall ensure communication on monitoring the progress of studies for the residents.

## Transport

Rail transport shall be a sufficient, affordable and encouraging manner to
 move around. There shall be functional rail transport between campuses.

- Public transport within and between campus cities shall be affordable,
- 67 functional and environmentally friendly. Public transport shall be developed in
- 68 accordance with the needs of the students.
- Evening and weekend departures of internal public transport in campus cities
- 70 shall be increased. Public transport shall be a more economically feasible
- 71 alternative than private car use.
- Walking and riding a bike shall be possible and safe throughout the year.
- Walking, riding a bike and public transport shall be the preferably maintained,
- developed and considered modes of transport over driving in city planning.
- 75 Everyday locally accessible services shall be reasonably reached by walking, with
- 76 a bike or with public transport.
- In traffic planning, walking and riding a bike shall be treated as separate
- 78 modes of traffic. Instead of combined cycle paths and footpaths, traffic planning
- 79 shall invest in separating them into footpaths and cycle paths.
- Campus cities shall have a functional city bike system.

# 82 University

- The university shall provide the students with sufficient and high-quality counselling throughout the studies in a cross-faculty manner.
- Eternal right to study shall be restored.
- University campuses shall have sound-proof group working spaces where
- 88 students can work undisturbed. The premises shall be adequately furnished and
- 89 accessible also during evenings.
- University teaching staff shall have sufficient pedagogical skills and possibility
- 91 to complement their pedagogical competence.
- Academic subjects shall collect feedback on their teaching and activities
- 93 systematically. On the basis of the provided feedback, necessary development
- 94 activities shall be initiated.
- Equal and collegial tripartite decision-making shall be realised, enabling
- 96 students' participation in the decision-making and its preparation at all
- 97 administrative levels of the university.
- Subject-specific student associations shall be involved in the decision-making
- of their academic subjects, schools and departments, since subject-specific
- student associations are the best experts in student matters in their own field.

- ISYY encourages its students to become student representatives in the administration.
- The Language Centre shall be guaranteed sufficient resources to organise
- teaching in order for the completion of language and communication studies not
- 105 slowing down other studies.
- The dual model shall be retained, but moving between the dual model shall be
- 107 flexible. ISYY encourages cooperation between universities and universities of
- 108 applied sciences.
- University communication and activities shall be clear and accessible both in
- 110 Finnish and in English.
- The university shall ensure the training of the staff with regard to electronic
- 112 study platforms and equipment. The teaching staff shall commit to the use of
- unified electronic study platforms considering discipline-specific needs.
- Tutoring shall be of high quality and tutor training shall be developed, for
- example, on the basis of feedback received from the training.
- Campus buildings shall be regularly maintained, the quality of indoor air shall
- be actively monitored and the equipment of the buildings shall be of as high-
- 118 quality and unified as possible.
- All campus libraries and independent study premises shall be accessible 24/7.
- Subject-specific student associations shall have equal possibilities to access
- 121 cross-disciplinary and cost-free premises for subject-specific student
- 122 associations.
- The university shall not cooperate or conclude partnership agreements with
- universities from states conducting a war of aggression and/or dumping human
- rights, excluding agreements concerning exchange and international students.

## 127 Studying

- Learning, education and research must form an intrinsic value at the
- 129 university.
- The university shall enable all-year studying for students. During summer,
- 131 courses where students can genuinely promote their studies shall be provided.
- Students shall have the right to hold several study rights.
- The supervision of theses shall enable cooperation with different faculties and
- 134 universities.
- At the university, all disciplines shall enable flexible completion of studies,
- 136 considering discipline-specific needs.

- Degree-specific and specific entrance examination admission or course
  admission shall be the primary route to the university.
- Those who have completed secondary education shall have an equal
- opportunity for university studies. Student admission shall emphasise entrance
- and applicability examinations. Poor success in secondary education shall not
- impact admission to universities in a negative manner if the applicant has
- 143 prerequisites for studying.
- New students needing special support shall be provided with targeted support
- 145 for orientation into university studies.
- The university shall enable transferring from one major subject to another.
- The university shall maintain free right to minor subjects genuinely enabling
- students to study in both campuses regardless of the student's campus city.
- Bilingualism or language and communication studies completed in other
- universities shall form sufficient justification for credit recognition of courses.
- Working life and studies shall be possible to combine.
- The university shall support students' entrepreneurship education and
- 153 working life education.
- Whenever possible, it shall be possible to follow lectures remotely, and video
- recordings shall be provided.
- Study credits shall correspond to the amount of work at courses.
- Everyone shall have the possibility to freely include a reasonable amount of
- 158 other minor subjects in a degree.
- Study environments shall serve different manners of learning and teaching.
- Study environments shall be ergonomic and accessible. Special arrangements
- related to accessibility shall be communicated.
- Digitalisation and digital accessibility shall be considered when reforming
- 163 study environments.

- 167 The basic principle in students' income is that existing students' support modes
- and subsidies shall enable full-time studying.

### 170 Students' social welfare and benefits

- ISYY conducts influencing on study subsidy.
- ISYY supports basic income.
- ISYY supports social welfare reform and actively influences its preparation.
- For basic social assistance, the conditions related to lowering the basic part
- shall be reviewed for students in order not to be treated unequally in relation to
- other applicants of basic social assistance.
- A student cafeteria must provide at least 1 warm meal per day. Students' meal
- 178 subsidy shall cover the maximum costs of a meal and the meals shall be
- 179 responsibly produced and in accordance with sustainable choices.
- Student discounts shall cover all students, including exchange and doctoral
- 181 students.

## Study subsidy

- ISYY promotes the raise of students' income limits.
- The payment of a study grant shall be based on the progress of studies.
- When the studies progress in accordance with the schedule, a student shall
- not be punished for active working through cuts in study subsidy.
- When applying for basic social assistance, student loan that has not been
- taken out shall not be considered income.
- The number of study subsidy months exceeding the target schedule shall be
- 191 automatically increased.
- Study grant shall guarantee everyone an equal possibility to study full-time.
- Students with children shall have a parent raise in their study grant.
- Study grant and student loan compensation shall be tied to an index.
- The staggering of study subsidy and student loan compensation shall be
- 196 removed.

# Housing support

- Housing support shall be clarified. The support shall be predictable and
- 200 flexible with regard to life situations.
- Students shall be guaranteed a possibility for affordable housing.
- Students shall be restored under general housing support.

## 204 Well-being

- ISYY promotes and supports non-smoking.
- ISYY encourages not using intoxicants in student activities.
- ISYY shall take an active role in order for every member to find their place as
- 208 part of the student community. The role of social commitments shall be taken
- into account in the fluency of the progression of studies.
- Exchange students and doctoral students shall be covered by FSHS.
- The quality of FSHS substance abuse services shall be sufficient.
- The focus of FSHS shall be in preventive healthcare.
- Mental health services received through FSHS shall be easily accessible and
- 214 the customer shall receive necessary services from one place.
- FSHS shall provide cost-free contraception for all students.
- Cost-free sanitary products shall be available through FSHS.
- Both campuses shall have equal number of experts in students' well-being.
- Students shall have wide-ranging sports possibilities and services.
- Sufficient premises shall be guaranteed for university sports, especially
- 220 SYKETTÄ services, available for staff and students equally.
- Sports services support pause gymnastics and active lifestyle.
- Everyone has a right to a healthy study environment. University buildings must
- 223 not have indoor air problems.
- ISYY supports unscented university buildings. Hygiene products used at the
- 225 university shall be non-allergenic.
- ISYY does not approve discrimination, bullying, racism, sexual harassment or
- inappropriate behaviour in any form. In order to address them, ISYY shall have
- 228 its own equality and non-discrimination programme.
- The university shall have instructions to solve harassment issues and a contact
- 230 person that a student can contact with a low threshold and anonymously, if
- 231 needed. The person who reported harassment and their identity shall be
- 232 protected.
- Students shall be provided with comfortable leisure possibilities and premises
- 234 equally in the campuses.
- The aesthetics of the study environment is part of well-being at studies.

# Internationality

- Internationality shall be a seamless part of ISYY's and UEF's activities.
- Internationality means diverse understanding and mutually respecting
- 241 interaction.
- International students' everyday life and settling into student community shall
- be supported with sufficient orientation and high-quality tutoring.
- ISYY and UEF provide low-threshold possibilities for internationalisation at
- 245 home for Finnish students.
- Students shall be encouraged to participate in international tutor activities.
- Possibility shall be provided to include non-Finnish courses and those
- 248 supporting internationality skills into degrees.
- The degree requirements of international degree students shall include
- 250 studies in domestic languages and culture.
- Networking and working life skills needed in working life shall be included in
- 252 international master's programmes.
- Internationality shall be possible for everyone UEF shall reserve sufficient
- 254 funds to support the mobility of staff and students.
- Exchange studies shall not significantly slow down studies.
- Cost-free studies or comprehensive grant programmes shall be guaranteed for
- everyone, including students outside EU and EEA countries.
- Completing a degree in Finland shall facilitate the granting of citizenship to
- 259 students coming from outside EU and EEA countries.

## **Environment**

- ISYY promotes sustainable development by supporting ethical consumption
- and by using corresponding products in its procurement.
- ISYY shall be carbon-neutral by 2030. Carbon-neutrality shall be primarily
- 266 pursued by decreasing emissions and secondarily by compensating emissions.
- ISYY encourages wide-ranging and vegetable-rich student food.
- ISYY and UEF shall decrease private car use by encouraging riding a bike,
- 269 public transport and carpooling.
- ISYY and UEF shall avoid unnecessary use of paper and consider the
- 271 environmental burden caused by the use of Al.
- Products used for cleaning the campuses and for maintaining hygiene shall be
- 273 environmentally and allergy-friendly and unscented.

- Students shall be reserved with a certain number of affordable parking
- 275 permits at the campus areas. Parking permits shall be granted with discretion.
- ISYY encourages campus cities to construct with Finnish food.
- University campuses, student apartments and Student Union premises shall
- 278 have sufficient and high-quality recycling possibilities. Recycling instructions
- shall be available both in Finnish and in English.
