#### 1 Introduction

The Environmental Programme of the Student Union of the University of Eastern Finland (ISYY) sets the environmental principles and objectives for the Student Union and its activities. The programme also describes practical means for implementing the principles and achieving the objectives. The programme plays an important role in the way in which environmental considerations are taken into account by those working for and in cooperation with the Student Union.

The previous Environmental Programme dates back to 2015, and an update was deemed necessary. The aim is to make the programme more tangible, including concrete objectives and measures that will be taken into account by those working for and in cooperation with the Student Union. The Student Union is committed to implementing the Environmental Programme by decision of the Representative Council. Furthermore, the members of the ISYY Executive Board must implement the programme within their own sectors, and report its implementation annually. In future, the Student Union is committed to updating the Environmental Programme at an interval of every other term of the Representative Council.

## 2 Implementation of the Programme

#### 2.1 Principles and Objectives of the Programme

- 21 Environmental principles form the basis of the Environmental Programme and also 22 provide guidelines for the objectives and measures to be set. The environmental 23 principles and the measures used to achieve them are as follows:
  - ISYY plays an active role in environmental matters by taking them into account in its own activities and by encouraging partner institutions and stakeholders to do the same.
    - The Annual Report includes a section detailing the measures taken by the Executive Board to implement the Environmental Programme across different sectors.
  - ISYY acts as a responsible student union that promotes sustainable development from an ecological, economic, social and cultural point of view.
    - Each year, the Action Plan of ISYY features one sub-theme focusing on sustainable development, including how the chosen sub-theme will be taken into consideration at every sector and event, as well as throughout Student Union communications.
  - ISYY actively promotes environmental awareness by way of its activities and communications.
    - Throughout the year, ISYY members are regularly informed about environment and climate related theme days, and members are actively encouraged to participate in discussions, campaigns and events. Environmental communication is an established feature of ISYY's Communication Strategy.
  - Environmental principles are put into practice through objectives and a proposed set of measures. This programme contains both general and more detailed environmental objectives that relate to different areas of activity within the Student Union. The general objectives of the Environmental Programme are as follows:

- 1. The Environmental Programme will become a central pillar of how the Student Union operates.
- 2. The objectives of the Environmental Programme are achieved and the proposed set of measures are put into practice.
  - 3. In accordance with the objectives set out in the Environmental Programme, different stakeholders, such as student organisations, will take an environmental perspective into consideration in their activities.

## 2.2 Monitoring and Reporting of the Programme

The Representative Council and the Executive Board are responsible for monitoring the implementation of the Environmental Programme. The Executive Board implements the programme as a part of all activities, while the Representative Council monitors the implementation of the programme. The Executive Board member responsible for environmental matters is also responsible for coordinating the implementation of the Environmental Programme within the Executive Board and sharing reports with the Representative Council.

The annual report is shared with the Representative Council at the end of the calendar year, before the following year's budget and action plan have been approved. The report must indicate how the principles of the Environmental Programme have been complied with, to which extent the objectives have been achieved and how the Student Union has utilised the proposed measures in its general operations. In addition, the report should detail how the Student Union has communicated about the programme to stakeholders, such as student organisations, and what means have been used to encourage them to comply with it. The report must also include practical ideas that could be used to improve the implementation of the Environmental Programme in the future.

## 2.3 Environmental campaigning

Environmental campaigning plays an essential role in the way that ISYY's Environmental Programme is implemented, and action against climate change is a notable element of the campaigning. Environmental campaigning is an important component of both ISYY's internal and external communications. ISYY members are provided with environmental communications and they receive information about environment-related events organised by the Student Union, among other things. In addition, environmental campaigning is incorporated into other ISYY activities, such as the annual training sessions that are organised for student organisations.

ISYY's active and enthusiastic environmental campaigning is not directed only at ISYY members, but also the management of UEF, the city councils of Joensuu and Kuopio, as well as other partner institutions. The campaigns are designed so that both current environmental issues and long-term environmental objectives are taken into consideration. When it comes to environmental matters and campaigning, ISYY works in collaboration with the environmental sector of the National Union of University Students in Finland (SYL) and other student unions around Finland. Due to student unions' role as active players in society, ISYY also aims to participate in the public debate and discussion regarding environmental issues. When official statements are made or opinions shared with the general public, the arguments used by ISYY must be based on independent, scientifically evaluated knowledge or information from credible sources.

## 3 Activities of the Student Union (ISYY)

The Executive Board member responsible for environmental matters or another member of the Executive Board must be in regular contact (at least once during the autumn semester and once during the spring semester) with volunteers, actives and staff members working for ISYY regarding the implementation of the Environmental

Programme. The following sub-chapters introduce some of the ways in which environmental considerations should be taken into account in the activities of the Student Union.

#### 3.1 Meetings

Since the Representative Council, Executive Board and ISYY clubs hold regular meetings, the environmental perspective must be taken into account in the way meetings are conducted. The printing of meeting materials is to be avoided whenever possible. When the physical presence of participants is not required, meetings are held remotely in order to reduce unnecessary travel. Meeting facility bookings are optimised according to the number of participants, and energy is saved by switching off lights and devices that are not in use.

During meetings, ISYY is committed to serving ethical, eco-friendly food and drink that is locally produced, organic and Fair Trade certified, whenever possible. All food and drink that is served is vegan. The meeting catering should generate as little waste as possible, and hence special attention must be paid to the quantity and recyclability of the packaging materials. Reusable crockery and cutlery is preferred over disposable tableware, and the amount of food served must be optimised to meet the demand in order to avoid any food waste. Any waste generated during the meeting is sorted and disposed of in an appropriate manner.

## 3.2 Travel and Transportation

The Executive Board, Representative Council and ISYY staff members are required to travel between Kuopio and Joensuu as well as attend meetings and events around Finland throughout the year. If these meetings or events are very brief, or physical presence of participants is not required, they should be attended remotely. The need for travel is assessed on a case-by-case basis. When travelling is required, the form of public transport with the lowest levels of emissions should be used. However, if it is not

possible to use public transport due to unsuitable routes or schedules, carpooling is the next best option. People are encouraged to commit to low-carbon commuting, such as walking or cycling.

#### 3.3 Events

Environmental considerations are taken into account in the planning and implementation of any event organised by the Student Union with the aim of reducing the burden caused to the environment. Event advertising and communications are primarily conducted via digital communication channels, such as social media, while printed forms of communication are reduced to a minimum. However, if physical invitation letters or posters are required, they are printed on eco-labelled or 100% recycled paper.

Reusable crockery and cutlery is preferred over disposable tableware at events with catering, and food should come packaged in a manner that generates as little waste as possible. Efforts must be made to minimise food waste, while any waste generated during events is sorted and recycled in an appropriate manner. The food and drink served at events must be ethically and ecologically produced, and vegan wherever possible.

## 4 Stakeholders, Interest Groups and Partner Institutions

When ISYY cooperates and communicates with different stakeholders, interest groups and partner institutions, it is important to highlight the environmental perspective and raise awareness about relevant environmental issues.

#### 4.1 Student Organisations

Student organisations play an important role among university students by organising a wide range of activities for them. Student organisations are a critical link between students and the Student Union, but it should be noted that these organisations do not operate under the authority of ISYY. Therefore, student organisations cannot be instructed to act in a more environmentally friendly manner, but they can be encouraged to do so.

One of the most influential ways to encourage eco-friendly practices is to mofidy ISYY's grant application criteria: in order to receive grants, student organisations are required to demonstrate a willingness to take environmental considerations into account during their activities. The themes of the Environmental Programme are to be included in the annual organisation training sessions that are attended by board members of student organisations. During training the board members are provided with information about how environmental aspects can be taken into account in different activities and they are encouraged to turn to the Student Union for guidance on how environmental objectives can be set and achieved. ISYY also encourages student organisations to cooperate with their own school or department so that environmental issues are paid more attention to and the environmental objectives can be achieved. The Student Union must also facilitate the eco-friendliness of student organisations with practical measures, for example by loaning reusable crockery and cutlery that can be used at events instead of disposable ones. Student organisations are encouraged to take care of recycling at their events and premises.

#### 4.2 The University

The Student Union cooperates closely with the University. ISYY is determined to ensure that there are student representatives in all of the working groups and other decision-making bodies of UEF, allowing ISYY to actively initiate and promote environment-related action at university level. At meetings that are held between ISYY and UEF staff, the environmental perspective must be deliberately highlighted in order to encourage change. The Student Union must be determined in regards to achieving its environmental objectives and, when necessary, the views of the UEF representatives must be challenged in order to improve the overall environmental performance of the University.

When ISYY and UEF organise events together, ISYY must ensure that environmental matters are taken into account. The Student Union must encourage the University to achieve the environmental objectives set out in the Strategy of UEF (UEF 2030 – Seizing a Sustainable Future). The Student Union is engaged in lobbying the University to design subject-specific study modules on sustainable development that boost students' professional skills and promote their awareness of sustainable development in general. ISYY also encourages the University to share information about different environmentally-themes study opportunities with the student population. In addition, the Student Union must exert pressure on the University to commit to a divestment from fossil fuels.

## 4.3 Campus Cities

Since ISYY operates in two different locations, work must be done to influence both the City Council of Kuopio and the City Council of Joensuu. When talks are held with the representatives of Kuopio or Joensuu, ISYY must emphasise the importance of environmental considerations across the entire spectrum of the councils' activities from city planning to environmental monitoring.

ISYY exerts pressure on the councils to provide better public transport services, cycling routes, recycling facilities, eco-friendly housing and other initiatives that facilitate greener living. ISYY also encourages the councils to increase the amount of vegetarian food served at council-run offices, schools and other institutions. In addition, the city councils are encouraged to engage in ambitious environmental and climate action and budget a sufficient amount of money for environmental purposes. In general, they are encouraged to achieve their current environmental objectives and pursue new ones.

## 4.4 Other Stakeholders, Interest Groups and Partner Institutions

When the Student Union cooperates with different partner institutions, stakeholders and other interest groups, environmental considerations must be taken into account at all levels. The Student Union informs its partners about the Environmental Programme and encourages them to act in an eco-friendly manner as well. The following subchapters cover some of the Student Union's key partners with regards to environmental matters.

#### 4.4.1 Restaurants and Cafés on Campus

ISYY encourages the catering companies responsible for restaurants and cafés on UEF campuses to make ecological choices with regards to the food and drink being served. The catering companies are encouraged to reduce food waste, pay attention to the carbon footprint of the products on offer and increase the amount of plant-based options on the menu. The quality and appeal of plant-based menu options must be improved, without increasing the price of the lunch for students.

#### 4.4.2 Student Housing Companies Joensuun Elli and Kuopas

A considerable number of students live at rental apartments owned by student housing companies Joensuun Elli (in Joensuu) and Kuopas (in Kuopio). ISYY highlights the importance of reducing the carbon footprint of student accommodation and encourages

the student housing companies to consider environmental aspects in the way they operate. When talks are held with the student housing companies, environmental issues should be discussed by mutual agreement. The housing companies are encouraged to communicate more transparently about accommodation-related environmental objectives, switch to renewable sources of energy and invest in sustainable construction and renovation methods. In addition, pressure must be exerted on the companies to improve the energy efficiency of the student accommodation, including electric appliances.

#### 4.4.3. Campus Organisations

ISYY's environmental campaigning is also directed at campus organisations that are encouraged to take environmental matters into consideration in all activities. Since many campus organisations are active in different areas of the society, they are also encouraged to raise environmental issues among their peers and when participating in the public debate and discussion.

#### 4.4.4. Commercial Collaborations

The Student Union requests that existing collaboration partners take environmental issues into account in their business activities and makes it clear that cooperation can continue only if this condition is met. However, if a collaboration partner shows complete disregard towards environmental considerations, ISYY must terminate the cooperation agreement at the earliest opportunity. When new commercial collaborations are established, partners must agree to take environmental considerations into account in the way they operate, details of which are included in the terms of the cooperation agreement.

#### **5 Facilities**

- The Student Union has an office on each campus: the office space in Joensuu is owned
- by the University Properties of Finland Ltd (SYK), while the one in Kuopio is owned by
- the Student Union (ISYY). In addition, ISYY owns rental property elsewhere. The
- 268 principles set out in the Environmental Programme apply to the use of the Student
- Union facilities, regardless of whether they are owned or rented.

#### 5.1 Offices

#### 5.1.1 Energy Consumption

- 273 Practical measures are taken to reduce energy consumption at the offices, including
- switching off lights, computers and other electronic devices for the night, as well as
- 275 reducing the indoor temperature. However, the temperature should be kept at an
- ambient level that is considered comfortable by those working at the office.

#### 5.1.2 Waste Management and Cleaning

- 279 At the ISYY offices everything that can be recycled is recycled, including biowaste,
- paper, cardboard, glass, metal and plastic. Combustible waste, hazardous waste, as
- well as electrical and electronic waste are collected and recycled in a safe, appropriate
- 282 manner. The Student Union ensures that the offices are equipped with suitable
- 283 containers for waste management and clear instructions for recycling, and that cleaning
- is taken care of using eco-friendly products and cleaning equipment.

## 5.2 Properties of the Student Union

#### 5.2.1 Waste Management and Cleaning

- 288 Recycling must be taken care of at the properties owned by ISYY and recycling bins
- for different types of waste must be easy to use and readily available. Clear instructions

on how to sort waste are made available at all properties and information about recycling is shared with tenants and other people using the facilities. If the property is part of a limited liability housing company, ISYY aims to ensure that recycling is well-managed throughout the building complex.

If cleaning services are outsourced, it needs to be agreed that only eco-friendly products and cleaning equipment are used at the facilities, and one of the criteria for selecting the service provider should be their commitment to protecting the environment.

#### **5.2.2 Water and Energy Consumption**

Unnecessary consumption of water and energy should be avoided at the properties owned by ISYY. The tenants and those using the facilities are instructed to save energy by switching off lights, devices and the stove in the sauna when not in use. Whenever possible, the properties are only equipped with eco-friendly, energy-efficient appliances, devices and light bulbs. Water consumption is reduced by investing in high-quality plumbing fixtures, fittings and appliances that are well-maintained. The consumption of electricity and water at the Student Union facilities is monitored regularly and adjustments are made accordingly. The Environmental Programme must be kept in mind when selecting the electricity provider for the properties owned by ISYY: the electricity used must be environmentally friendly and come from renewable energy sources.

## **6 Acquisitions and Investments**

The Student Union aims to take environmental considerations into account during tendering and procurement processes. When buying furniture or equipment, the option that is sustainably manufactured and of higher quality should be selected. Before purchasing new goods, it must be ensured that ISYY does not have a similar item that could be used to avoid having to buy something new. The lifespan of existing furniture and equipment should be extended through servicing and repair, and ideally old items should only be replaced when they are beyond repair. Any disused pieces of furniture or equipment that are in good working order are either sold or recycled.

## **6.1 Office Equipment and Office Supplies**

Environmental considerations are also taken into account when purchasing office equipment and office supplies. With the shift to electronic communications, there is less need for printer paper. However, when paper products, such as printer paper and envelopes, are purchased, they must be Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certified.

Electronic equipment should only ever be purchased when absolutely necessary and when it is not possible to repair. Any office equipment purchased must be energy-efficient and of high quality.

## **6.2 Property Acquisition and Renovations**

The environmental aspect is always taken into account in property acquisition and renovations, including reflection on how essential and eco-friendly these activities are. When acquiring new property, the energy efficiency of the building should be an important factor to consider during the decision-making process. Furthermore, renovations should always aim to make the facilities more environmentally friendly.

#### 6.3 Investments

- 341 The Student Union aims to make investments that are both eco-friendly and ethical.
- 342 Whenever possible, investments are made in companies that support or provide
- environmentally friendly products and practices. Those responsible for investments are
- committed to the principles laid out in the Environmental Programme.
